Treetops Private Music Tuition Programme - Group and Individual Lessons

Students at Treetops have a number of options for private individual and/or group lessons. Our Private Music Tuition Programme offers the following instruments: piano, guitar (acoustic and electric), drums, and voice. Enrolled students are expected to commit to a minimum of one term of lessons.

LESSON LENGTH: Individual lessons are 15 - 30 minutes in length, depending on the student's age or other needs as discussed between parents/carers and their child's instrumental or voice tutor.

COST: The costs per lesson will depend upon instrument chosen, student age, and length of lesson. The peripatetic tutor will advise you when enrolment is processed. The fee is paid to the peripatetic music tutor directly if having individual or group lessons. Please note, fees are paid in advance of term start date and are charged at a flat rate dependent on the number of teaching weeks per term.

INSTRUMENT HIRE: Whilst it is assumed that some parents have their own family instruments, in the interest of making music accessible, the school offers guitar instrument hire options (acoustic – availability pending). Acoustic guitars are priced at \$20.00 per term and are invoiced through the school office.

PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES: Students taking part in group or individual lessons may have opportunities to perform at school and/or public events throughout the year at the discretion of the School Music Programme Coordinator. These performances may include Recital Morning, Performing Arts Night, Shuukai (whole school assembly) and The Darlington Arts Festival.

These opportunities are encouraged to allow students to show their growth, effort put into practice, commitment and, most of all, to have fun connecting and building friendships and community through the shared experience.

ENROLMENT: If your child wishes to take part in any of the lessons in the tables below, please fill out the attached application form and return to the School Office as soon as possible. Group and individual lessons will start in Week 1 of each term and lessons will complete the week before term ends. If your child wishes to take part in multiple options, only one application form is necessary (tick all boxes that apply). Please be aware this may mean your child will miss one or more school timetabled lessons per week.

If you swap instruments or add a new one after commencing in the programme, please complete a new form. Your details will be passed onto the nominated peripatetic music teacher, who will contact you directly to confirm your child's engagement in the programme and their lesson day.

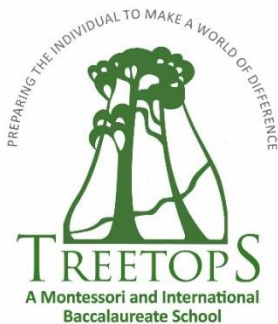
Tania Martin – Voice

CONDITIONS OF ENROLMENT:

A new enrolment is required for each student at the start of each year, even if continuing with the same tutor. Siblings will require separate forms.

Once received by the peripatetic tutor, the enrolment of a student into a music lesson will be scheduled in line with the School's timetable. Music lessons with peripatetic tutors will take place during the school day and will require students to be withdrawn from standard school classes. Group lessons may be scheduled for lunch breaks.

In cases where the numbers of students enrolling exceeds the available lessons, students may be put on a waiting list.

The peripatetic tutor is responsible for communicating lesson times to the parent/guardian.

The peripatetic tutor is responsible for sending invoices and communicating if there are any absences of a tutor.

In the case of student absence (e.g. illness/holiday), the parent/guardian is responsible for notifying the peripatetic tutor, in advance of the scheduled lesson taking place. There will be no makeup classes nor refunds. In the case of peripatetic tutor absence, the tutor will communicate this directly with the parent. In the case where the school has a reason to cancel the lesson e.g. excursions, whole school events, in-school assessments, this will be communicated to the peripatetic tutor, and where possible arrangements made to make up lessons. It is unlikely that there will be an option to make up any missed lessons on an alternative day of the week to that normally scheduled.

Students remain enrolled in the music programme throughout the year until written notice of withdrawal is given by the parent/guardian.

A new enrolment form is required to enrol for a new instrument or group lesson.

By signing this you agree:

- That the School will share your personal contact details with the peripatetic tutor. They will then be able to contact you with details about lessons and fees.
- To pay invoices directly to the peripatetic tutor in a timely manner, and understand that lessons may be put on hold until fees are paid.
- To your child being withdrawn each week from scheduled school class lessons to undertake their private music lesson. Group lessons may also take place during lunchtime breaks.
- To a timely advice to the peripatetic tutor of your child's absence from a lesson.
